Cheshire East Catering have this week advised us that they are increasing their prices significantly with effect from January 2024, and therefore we will have to increase the cost of paid school dinners to cover this increase. The cost of a child's school dinner will increase to £2.65 per day from 1st January 2024. School dinners should be paid for in advance via ParentPay. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are still entitled to Universal Free School Meals. Pupil Premium children throughout KS2 are also entitled to free school meals.
