Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces. As a school we have ensured that three members of our staff have been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care. The trained adults are Designated Safeguarding Lead – Miss Groarke and Deputy Safeguarding Lead Mrs Davies and ELSA Mrs Hales. The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right. We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
