We are now in the Easter season - a time for us to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. This follows the Triduum: three days before Easter, including Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

The liturgical colours in this wheel are represented on our prayer tables in each class and on our display in the main entrance. Keep a look out for them!

#### May – the month of Mary

May is devoted to celebrating and honouring Mary, the mother of Jesus. Mary is even sometimes known as the 'Queen of May'. During the month of May, we pray the Angelus or the Hail Mary daily.
