We had great fun watching the reaction between bicarbonate and vinegar to produce carbon dioxide gas to inflate a plastic glove and have also loved exploring the topic through Artis.

What a great start Year 4!









# Walking Home Safely

Please have conversations with your child about the potential dangers of interacting with strangers on the way to and from school. In particular, it is worth talking through the following guidelines, taken from <a href="Safe">Safe</a> <a href="Schools">Schools</a> and <a href="Police guidance">Police guidance</a> when having these discussions with your child.

# Safeguarding - Dog Safety Outside School

We would like to bring to your attention a serious safety concern that occurred today: a child was bitten by a dog that had been left unattended near the school grounds. Thankfully, the child is receiving appropriate care, but this incident highlights the importance of ensuring that all animals near school property are managed safely and responsibly.

• We kindly ask that you do not allow your child to touch or approach unattended dogs, even if they appear friendly. Unsupervised interactions can lead to unpredictable outcomes, especially with children who may not fully understand the risks.

Additionally, we urge all parents and carers to refrain from tying dogs to the fence near the passageway that children and adults use to walk along. We have observed that some dogs attempt to push through the fence. To ensure the safety and well-being of everyone, we ask that if you must tie your dog, please do so near the car park gate, where there is less foot traffic and greater visibility. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our school environment safe, calm, and welcoming for all. Thank you for your understanding and continued support.
