Focus on ... Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful start to the year! On Monday, we had an exciting Forest School session with Miss Hughes where we hunted for (pretend) bones around the field and forest area. We worked together to build a human skeleton, carefully choosing sticks, leaves, and stones to create a life-sized model. The children also got creative by designing skeletons of animals using natural materials. This linked perfectly with our current Science topic, Animals Including Humans.

In Maths, we've been focusing on addition and subtraction, spotting patterns, using number bonds within 10, and learning how to add across a 10. Our English lessons have been based on The Iron Man, where the children designed their own traps to catch the Iron Man. They presented their designs to the class, explaining the features and why they would work. We had great fun bringing our designs to life!

In RE, we've been learning about how we can look after God's world and those less fortunate than ourselves. Well done, Year 3, for all your hard work and creativity!

Explosive Erica Ignites Scientific Curiosity!







On Monday, our school was buzzing with excitement as Explosive Erica from the Mad Science Company led not one, but three thrilling science experiments. Her visit brought the wonders of chemistry and physics to life, leaving every child wide-eyed and inspired. Erica introduced us to fascinating scientists like Jacques Charles, known for his work on gases and flight. Then came the experiments—each more jaw-dropping than the last: Egg in a Bottle: Erica demonstrated how removing oxygen from a bottle can create pressure changes that pull an egg inside. Science magic! Red Cabbage pH Indicator: Using cabbage juice, she showed how everyday substances can reveal their acidity or alkalinity through colour changes. Fire Experiment: With safety front and centre, Erica wowed us with a fiery demonstration that taught us about combustion and chemical reactions. The children were absolutely mesmerised, hanging on every word and gasping with delight at each experiment. It was an assembly full of learning, laughter, and lots of "oohs" and "aahs"—a perfect spark to ignite a lifelong love of science!

Fairtrade Fortnight


